Our Church at Prayer...

Inviting you to think about our own church community, the wider church, the world!

- This week we pray for our JNC as they consider and interview potential ministers for GUC. Please pray for those potential ministers who are considering a call to Gungahlin Uniting as they work through what it might mean to leave family, friends and work in their hometown to move to Canberra.
- This week we join the Canberra Region Presbytery in praying for Yarralumla Uniting Church. Pray for the church council and elders as they prayerfully consider how to engage in mission in the Yarralumla community; for activities that seek to engage with the community: Gumnuts playgroup, Coffee group and Mini-Floriade display; for the upcoming Arts and Crafts Fair, held over the first weekend of November; and for the upcoming Advent and Christmas program that seeks to provide a space for tiredness/weariness alongside joy and celebration.
- This week we join with the World Council of Churches in praying for Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Peru. We pray for migrants and refugees seeking a new home, and those who accompany and support them; and for coca farmers to find sustainable incomes from other crops, for an end to drug trafficking, and effective assistance for those who are addicted.

Psychology and Spirituality

In his next few sermons Bruce will draw on his experience as a clinical psychologist to explore current interventions in psychological treatment and how they apply to spiritual growth. The following topics are planned:

- Radical acceptance
- Though diffusion
- Mindfulness
- Exposure
- Psychology change process
- Journalling
- Value clarification and committed living
- Choice Points

Such topics may be of interest to friends or family who would not usually attend worship services but would be interested in psychological growth.

Operation Christmas Child

Operation Christmas Child is a hands-on way to bless children in need around the world by filling shoeboxes with toys, hygiene items, school supplies and other fun gifts. These boxes are then sent to children in over 100 countries in the Name of Jesus Christ.



After receiving a shoebox gift, many children have the opportunity to enrol in The Greatest Journey – a bible study course that guides children through what it means to faithfully follow Jesus Christ.

Billabong will be coordinating the collation and collection of Operation Christmas Child boxes this year on behalf of Gungahlin Uniting Church. If you would like to participate, you can do so in the following ways:

- * fill an Operation Christmas Child box (available in the foyer) with suitable items. If you forget to get a box, you can fill an A4 sized shoebox instead;
- * provide individual items that we can include in boxes. Billabong will then put together boxes with these items:
- * donate \$12.50 cash in an envelope. This will help cover the costs associated with the collection, processing and shipping of each of the boxes.

Coffee Nook- Sunday Morning Teas

While we have enough volunteers to offer morning tea every 2nd weekend, we don't have enough to offer it every week. However, we'd like to encourage everyone to stay around to chat after church on non-morning tea mornings with a DIY tea/coffee. Tea and coffee supplies are now in the coffee nook, which can be found in the foyer on the left-hand side of the kitchen servery. It looks like a cupboard, but inside (inside the top doors) you'll find what you need to make yourself a tea or coffee. In the lower door you'll find a small fridge. If there's no milk in there, open one (you'll find long life milk in the upper cupboard) and write the date (marker pen is also there) on the carton – remember to pop it into the fridge when you are done.
